Invitation Priest "The Lord be with you." Priest "Lift up your hearts." People "We lift them up to the Lord." People "It is right and just."	
Preface and Acclamation People "Holy, holy, holy Lord, God of hosts. / Heaven and earth are full of your glory."	
Institution Narrative: Consecration People "We proclaim your Death, O Lord, / and profess your Resurrection / until you come again."	
Prayer for Unity and Intercessions People "Humbly we pray / that, partaking of the Body and Blood of Christ, / we may be gathered into one by the Holy Spirit" Priest "Through him, and with him, and in him, / O God, almighty Father, / in the unity of the Holy Spirit, / all glory and honor is yours, / for ever and ever." People "Amen"	
Our Father and Sign of Peace People "Our Father who art in heaven...Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses as we forgive those who trespass against us." Sign of Peace	
Invitation to Communion Priest "Behold the Lamb of God....Blessed are those called to the supper of the Lamb."	
Communion Priest/Eucharistic Minister "The Body of Christ." People "Amen." Eucharist Minister "The Blood of Christ People "Amen." The priest unites our prayers in the Prayer After Communion. People "Amen."
