



On the left, read the prayer. On the right, write your own prayer.


Dear God,



Baptism

In Baptism, we are welcomed into the Church. Catholics believe that, in Baptism, we are freed from the original sin we were born with.

Eucharist


In Eucharist, Catholics believe that the hosts and wine are blessed to become the Body and Blood of Christ. The Church joins together to share in a meal that remembers Jesus, like he asked his followers to do at the Last Supper.

Eucharist is also called Communion.

Confirmation

Catholics believe that in Confirmation, we are sealed with the gifts of the Holy Spirit. Confirmation is a celebration of Pentecost, when we believe that Jesus' followers were filled with God's word after the courage to spread Jesus' resurrection.



The Baptism of Jesus/Baptismal Promises

On the left, read the account of Jesus' baptism from Matthew 3:13–17. On the right, read the promises that Catholics make at their Baptisms.

The Baptism of Jesus (Matthew 3:13–17)

Then Jesus came from Galilee to John at the Jordan to be baptized by him.

John tried to prevent him, saying, "I need to be baptized by you, and yet you are coming to me?"

Jesus said to him in reply, "Allow it now, for thus it is fitting for us to fulfill all righteousness." Then he allowed him.

After Jesus was baptized, he came up from the water and behold, the heavens were opened [for him], and he saw the Spirit of God descending like a dove [and] coming upon him.

And a voice came from the heavens, saying, "This is my beloved Son, with whom I am well pleased."

And all his empty promises? **I do.**


Do you believe in God, the Father Almighty, creator of heaven and earth? **I do.**
