

Fourth Grade: Lesson 19

Commandments 19 and 20: Guiding My Choices

Lesson Objective:

This lesson should focus on commandments IX and X. After studying all the commandments, children are asked to memorize them.

Learning Outcomes: Students will ...

- Memorize and recite the Ten Commandments in order (CCC following 2051, The Ten Commandments).
- Explain the deeper meaning of each of the Ten Commandments and discuss disobedience to the Ten Commandments as sinful and harmful to our relationship with God focusing on commandments IX and X.

Materials Needed:

- Prayer space items, Bibles, pencils, scissors, glue, pictures that can be cut,
- Copies: 10 Commandments Fill in the Blank, Thou Shall Not to Thou Shall, 10 Commandments in Pictures, the 10 Commandment or Beatitude that Means the Most to Me, 10 Commandments Fill in the Blank, I have Who Has Game (needs to be prepared ahead of time)

As Students Enter Class:

- Students may enjoy filling in the blanks for the 10 Commandments.
- [10 Commandments Fill In the Blank](#) OR there is one provided at the end of this lesson on LANE.

Beginning of Class:

- Gather around your prayer space and pray a prayer of your choosing.
- Ask God to open your hearts and mind to hear His word.
- If you used the Fill in the Blank activity, take a few minutes to review the correct answers.

Lesson Order	Implementation Ideas
Lesson 19 Video	<p>This video is .26 in length.</p> <p>Highlights: Today we are finishing our study of the 10 Commandments, by focusing on the 9th and 10TH Commandments.</p> <p>9th: You shall not covet your neighbor's wife.</p> <p>10th: You shall not covet your neighbor's goods (property).</p>
Read and Discuss	<p>These slides explain the last two Commandments. They also provide memory aides for memorizing the 10 Commandments.</p> <p>Help your students understand the importance of memorizing the 10 Commandments because they help us live virtuous lives. In 5th grade, there are several lessons about virtues.</p>
Memorize the 10 Commandments	<p>This Christine in Action Video is 1:14 in length.</p> <p>You can play it several times, if your students are engaged and you feel it helps them memorize the commandments.</p>
Commandments 9 and 10: Thou Shall Not to Thou Shall	<p>Just as you have done in previous lessons, change the wording of thou shall not to thou shall.</p> <p>This can be done all together, individually or in pairs.</p>
The 10 Commandments in Pictures	<p>Finish this activity as you have done in previous lessons.</p>
The 10 Commandments or Beatitude that Means the Most	<p>Encourage students to think about one Commandment or Beatitude that is important to them. It is helpful for students to verbally state their support before putting it in writing.</p> <p>Help students understand that regular reflection on God's laws will help them deepen their</p>

	relationship with God, the Father, God, the Son, and God, the Holy Spirit.
10 Commandment Fill in the Blank	Check students understanding by having them complete this page.
I Have Who Has Game	This will need to be printed and prepared ahead of time. It is a fun way to review the 10 Commandments. You can also play it next week. <u>I Have Who Has Game</u>
