




Sacrament of Confirmation

Directions: Place 2 small baskets or boxes on the table to put question cards in. Put the question cards in one basket (the other basket will be for discards). Place your markers on START. Roll the die and move that many spaces. Follow the directions on the space you land on. If the player lands on a "?", the person to their right draws a question card and reads it out loud. If the player answers correctly, they stay where they are. If they are not correct, they go back to where they were and follow the directions on the space. If the player lands on "Slide Back" they slide back to where the arrow points to. If the player lands on "Slide Ahead" they slide ahead to where the arrow points to. If the player lands on a space with "Trade Places" on it, they must trade places with another player. The first player to FINISH wins. Continue playing to find out who comes in second, third, fourth, etc. place.






Directions- Print out Directions, cut it out, and glue on front of file folder.




